PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHERS

OVERVIEW

Primary School teachers are responsible for the provision of a quality learning program within a safe and effective learning environment for students in their classes and the School as a whole.

1. KEY RELATIONSHIPS

Primary School Teachers ultimately report to the Principal through the Head of Primary School via their Head of Stage and other senior staff in the Primary School.

2. **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 2.1 With the Heads of Stage, collaborate to develop high quality teaching and learning programs in accordance with the requirements of NESA syllabuses and the Primary School
- 2.2 Plan and deliver highly effective class lessons to meet the needs of the students in a stimulating, engaging and positive learning environment
- 2.3 Focus keenly upon the systematic development of Literacy and Numeracy skills, applying skills across all learning areas
- 2.4 In careful consultation with the Head of Stage, liaise with colleagues, parents/carers and external specialists in support of students with student care and/or learning needs
- 2.5 Ensure teaching and learning is carefully and appropriately differentiated to meet the varying needs of students, promoting personal excellence
- 2.6 Engage a range of pedagogical approaches to meet student needs
- 2.7 Understand and implement the breadth of School policies and procedures
- 2.8 Attend to WHS requirements and proactively promote safety, risk assessment and management, and exercise of duty of care to all our students

- 2.9 Be fully conversant with all issues in relation to Child Protection including acting as a mandatory reporter for the purposes of child protection, informing the Head of Primary School immediately and confidentially of any concerns arising
- 2.10 Provide meaningful assessments and maintain accurate records of student learning and produce high quality reports for parents and carers, in accordance with School requirements, and to inform future Teaching
- 2.11 Maintain timely and accurate records including student-related meetings, registered teaching programs, assessment data
- 2.12 Engage in regular professional learning and development to enhance professional practice and maintain professional accreditation with NESA
- 2.13 Actively participate in the School's Cocurricular program, including the attendance on overnight camps as required
- 2.14 Understand, support and implement the welfare systems of the Primary School
- 2.15 Attend to the welfare, pastoral disciplinary needs of all students, in careful consultation with your Head of Stage



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- 2.16 Actively promote a welcoming, attractive, safe and respectful learning community and environment
- 2.17 Provide positive and active supervision while on assigned supervisory duties, moving constantly through the assigned supervision space
- 2.18 Contribute to School publications, assemblies, presentations and activities as required

3. QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

Primary School Teachers must hold:

- 3.1 an appropriate tertiary qualification recognised by NESA related to the education of Primary age students
- 3.2 current Teacher Accreditation with NESA, with a commitment to the Australian Professional Teaching Standards
- 3.3 a valid NSW Working With Children Check
